



Workshop: Using the IPPC Guidelines to comply with the Obligations in the New Clean Air Act concerning Obtaining an Air Permit

Time Frame: 14th / 15th of March

With the New Clean Air Act coming into force in January 2011, all industrial sectors are obligated to obtain an Air Permit as a condition for continuing their activities. The Air Permits will be distributed depending on the facilities meeting the terms of the IPPC directive concerning the use of the Best Available Technology (BAT) for the prevention and reduction of air emissions.

As a means of checking if the facilities technology complies with this criteria, the Israeli Ministry of Environmental Protection has chosen to use the IPPC-guidelines, the so called BAT REFerence documents (BREFs) as the basis for the new permit requirements. The BREF's are technical guideline documents that address the Best Available Technology applicable in various industry sectors.

As this approach is rather new in Israel, both industries and environmental authorities need to prepare in order to have a smooth and effective implementation of the IPPC-based approach in practice.

This training aims to provide the theoretical knowledge, practical guidance and tools and procedural aspects to both the industries and the environmental authorities, to contribute to such sound implementation. This will lead to lesser time and money consuming implementation in practice.

Most of the lectures will be in English.
